

RECIPE

Napolita Cheese Dip

Submitted by Frank Miller, M.D. of Havre

This is basically my Mom's recipe, but, of course she used pimiento peppers and made pimiento cheese. I think Mexican nopalitos or cactus pickles are a delicious and colorful change of pace.

INGREDIENTS

1 cup mayonnaise, I use Duke's ½ cup Walla Walla onion, finely chopped

1 lb. sharp cheddar cheese, finely grated

1/4 tsp. cayenne pepper

1/2 cup well-drained nopalitos, finely chopped

DIRECTIONS

Blend all ingredients in a food processor or immersion blender. Refrigerate for several hours before serving. Serve with crackers, toast or vegetables. Or use as filling for deviled eggs.

RECIPE

Old Fashioned Bread Pudding

INGREDIENTS

4 cups of broken up bread pieces (use 5 cups for firmer pudding)

2 cups milk, scalded with ¼ cup butter

½ cup sugar

2 eggs, slightly beaten

1/4 tsp. salt

1 tsp. cinnamon

½ cup seedless raisins

DIRECTIONS

Preheat oven to 350° . Place bread pieces in a 1 ½ quart baking dish. In a bowl blend the scalded milk/butter mixure, sugar, eggs, salt, cinnamon and raisins. Place baking dish in a pan of hot water, 1 inch deep. Bake 40 to 45 minutes or until silver knife inserted 1 inch from the edge comes out clean. Serve warm with cream or cool whip.

RECIPE

Brunch Bake

INGREDIENTS

1/2 medium onion, chopped 1 cup chopped ham 12 eggs

1/2 cup each cheddar and mozzarella cheese, shredded Salt and pepper to taste 1 tube of buttermilk biscuits

1/2 cup chopped chives

DIRECTIONS

In a medium size bowl mix eggs until well blended. Add onion, ham, cheese, salt, and pepper. Mix until combined well. Put buttermilk biscuits in a greased 9" x 9" baking pan. Pour egg mixture on top. Sprinkle chives over egg mixture. Bake 30-35 minutes at 350°.



WHAT A GREAT ANNUAL MEETING 2016!

Triangle Telephone Cooperative Association, Inc., doing business as Triangle Communications (Triangle), held its



63rd Annual Meeting of Members on Saturday, October 15, 2016. Close to 170 voting members, plus numerous guests, attended the meeting held in the Student Union Building on the campus of Montana State University-Northern in Havre. The 300 attendees enjoyed a delicious meal catered by MSU-Northern.



During the business portion of the meeting, fellow Board members, CEO/GM, Craig Gates, and Triangle member, Senator Jon Tester, thanked retiring Board member Verlin Reichelt for his 31 years of dedicated service to the cooperative. Many important topics related to the cooperative



were discussed including the changes coming from the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) that will reduce the funding Triangle

receives from the Universal Service Fund (USF): how Triangle would offset the reduction in funding by continuing to look at ways to complete fiber upgrades in a way to reach more of our membership for less; reducing Triangle's expenses and the increase in Triangle Mobile coverage with more towers and improved offerings.

Doug Lowry, District 1, and Don Bitz, District 2, were reelected to represent their respective districts on the Triangle Board. Dave Schwarzbach was elected to represent District 6 (at large)



to replace retiring Triangle Board member, Verlin Reichelt. Tom Bangs remains President of the Board, Rich Stuker will serve as Vice President and Rick Pokorny remains Secretary/Treasurer.



CHANGES TO THE LIFELINE PROGRAM

Lifeline is a federal program designed to help low-income Americans pay for vital telecommunications services. Important changes to the program took effect December 2, 2016, including the addition of broadband services.



- Medicaid
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program
- Federal Public Housing Assistance
- The Veteran's Pension or Survivor's Pension benefit

Tribal Benefits have remained the same. Those benefits include:

- Tribal (TANF) Temporary Assistance for Needy Families
- BIA or General Assistance
- Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations
- Head Start (income eligible only)

Consumers at or below 135 percent of the Federal Poverty Guidelines and those who qualified previously through any of the Tribal criteria will continue to be eligible for a Lifeline benefit.

To find out whether you qualify for Lifeline assistance, customers must fill out standard forms, available at your local telephone company's office, as mandated by the Federal and/or State government. Your telephone company is not responsible for determining who qualifies for these programs or who receives assistance. Customers must meet specific criteria in order to obtain assistance with their local telephone service, and qualifying is dependent upon government-established guidelines. To qualify for Lifeline credit, each customer must apply and provide proof that he/she, or a household member for whom he/she is financially responsible, participates in at least one of the programs listed or that the customer meets the income-based requirements. Additional eligibility requirements may also apply. Consumers are allowed only one Lifeline program benefit per household. The Lifeline discount can only be used for one communication type: Landline voice, Mobile voice, Fixed Broadband, or Mobile data.

GROWING FROM WITHIN

White Sulphur Springs

The ebb and flow in downtown White Sulphur Springs is positive. As the local telecommunication provider, Triangle Communications (Triangle) would like to believe it started in 2013 with a major construction project that upgraded services in the entire White Sulphur Springs area to a fiber optic network, but we know it's more of a direct correlation to residents, business owners and local leaders moving in the right direction to grow their community from within.

In addition to new streets, sidewalks and historic lighting, downtown White Sulphur Springs celebrates a diverse array of new businesses.

The Haymaker Bakery opened this past June and is already famous for its rich coffee and sticky buns. The bakery shares a name with the local Haymaker Creek and Canyon and its logo celebrates the strength of local "haymakers".

Owner Kimberly Deschene recruited Holly Showalter, with her years of experience, to run the bakery. Serving breakfast and lunch, this comfy space features custom made counters of reclaimed wood from area barns and free WiFi access.



Chris and Barry Hedrich began searching for options to fill their empty nest syndrome and boost the local economy of their com-



munity. Armed with a passion for beer and the love of Stanley and Leroy, their basset hounds, 2 Basset Brewery was established in a remodeled storefront this past year. Their brews, made as much as possible using local ingredients, have doggedly friendly names such as Stanley Stout, Drooligan, Anticipation and Bassito to name a few. Serving as a community gathering place, the Hedrich family has created a very friendly social setting for locals and visitors alike to enjoy locally brewed craft beer.

Neither business partner Alaina Gordon nor Bodie Morrison have twin sisters. but Twin Sisters Trading **Company**, a newly opened mercantile space in White Sulphur Springs, is theirs. Alaina reports the planning process was lengthy and painful, but "we wanted



to be in White Sulphur Springs, drawing on its potential. We scrounged our funds and studied to make it work." They purchased the building in 2015 and opened just before hunting season in fall 2016. The owners add, "People have discovered the area, they are coming and now they (and locals) can shop, leaving additional

dollars in our local economy." Both Bodie and Alaina are artisans. Bodie, who is retaining his construction job during the business startup phase, renovated the space which included refurbishing the wood floors and creating wood shelving and displays with wood sourced from the area. Alaina manages the store on a daily basis but during downtime, she can be found behind the retail counter with her guitar, writing and generating beautiful lyrical tunes. She admits, "we're terrified, but it's extremely exciting."

The trading post is a natural fit for the community. They have a wide selection of goods including hunting and fishing supplies, outdoor gear and are working to fulfill the needs identified in a creative idea board. FYI, the Twin Sisters noted in the mercantile's name are representative of mountain peaks located in the nearby Big Belt mountain range.

WHY DOES FIBER NEED A POWER SUPPLY?

Subscribers in our fiber served areas will notice that they have an Internal Power Supply (pictured to the left) that is plugged into an electrical outlet. So why does fiber need a power supply?

The Optical Network Terminal (ONT) where the fiber connects to your home wiring needs electricity to work. Fiber cannot carry an electrical charge so the power supply keeps the ONT working. If the power goes out, the battery back-up in the power supply is designed to keep your phone working for about eight hours depending on the phone and Internet usage during the outage. The more you use the phone or Internet during an outage the less time your battery will last.

It is also important to remember to keep the Internal Power Supply plugged in. If it is unplugged, the battery will eventually go dead and your phone and Internet service will stop working. The power supply has lights in the upper right-hand corner of the device. The "DC" light will be green if the device is plugged in. If the power supply is unplugged or there is a power outage, the light will be orange. The battery light will turn red if there is a problem with the battery.
