

RECIPE

Hattie's Molasses Krinkles

MIX TOGETHER THOROUGHLY

34 cup soft shortening1 cup brown sugar1 egg14 cup dark molasses

SIFT TOGETHER AND STIR IN

2 ¼ cups flour 2 tsp soda ¼ tsp salt ½ tsp cloves 1 tsp ginger 1 tsp cinnamon Chill dough. Roll into balls and dip tops in sugar. Place sugared side up on baking sheet. Sprinkle each cookie with 2-3 drops of water. Bake at 350° for 9-10 minutes.

RECIPE

Holiday Cherry Cheese Bars

From HCE/Triangle Cooking for a Cure Cookbook

CRUST

1 cup walnut pieces, divided 1 ¼ cups all purpose flour ½ cup firmly packed brown sugar ½ cup butter flavored Crisco ½ cup flake coconut

FILLING

2 (8 oz. each) pkgs. Cream cheese, softened 2/3 cup granulated sugar

2 eggs

2 tsp. vanilla

1 (21 oz.) can cherry pie filling

DIRECTIONS

Heat oven to 350°. Grease a 13x9x2 inch pan and set aside. Chop $\frac{1}{2}$ cup nuts coarsely for topping; set aside. Chop remaining $\frac{1}{2}$ cup nuts finely. Combine flour and brown sugar; cut in Crisco until fine crumbs form. Add $\frac{1}{2}$ cup finely chopped nuts and coconut. Mix well. Remove $\frac{1}{2}$ cup of crumb mixture and set aside. Press remaining crumbs in bottom of greased pan. Bake for 12-15 minutes, until edges are lightly browned.

Beat cream cheese, granulated sugar, eggs and vanilla in a small bowl at medium speed until smooth. Spread over hot baked crust. Return to oven and bake 15 minutes longer. Spread cherry pie filling over cheese layer. Combine reserved coarsely chopped nuts and reserved crust crumbs. Sprinkle evenly over cherries. Return to oven and bake another 15 minutes. Cool; refrigerate several hours and cut into bars.

RECIPE

Fudge Squares

Submitted by Ila McClenahan of Havre, MT

INGREDIENTS

2 cubes margarine

2 cups sugar

6 Tbsp cocoa

1 cup milk

2 cups flour

3 eggs

1 tsp. vanilla

½ cup chopped nuts

FROSTING

6 Tbsp brown sugar

3 Tbsp cocoa

4 Tbsp butter or margarine

4 Tbsp milk

DIRECTIONS

Mix softened margarine, sugar and cocoa very well. Then add eggs and beat. Add milk and flour alternately. Beat well. Add vanilla and nuts. Bake in 10 X 13" pan at 375° oven until done, usually about 25 minutes.

Frosting: Mix all ingredients and boil 2 minutes. Cool slightly and add enough powdered sugar to spread over the squares. Cut into 24 squares with a half walnut on each square.

Note: This was my mother's (Gertrude Whaley) recipe. She made them for nearly every potluck dinner she went to and always kept some in the freezer for whenever someone would stop by for coffee.


According to the last census, the population of Moore is just under 200 people, but you would never know it by the number of amazing businesses in the area.

It seems like all I have talked about in my CEO messages since March is COVID-19. Unfortunately, this continues to be our reality. As I write this, our lobby remains closed to the public. If you have any landline or Internet needs that Triangle may fulfill, please give us a call. We still have employees here in the office and remote workers who are happy to assist you with your phone and Internet services. Triangle understands the importance of keeping you connected.

It has been a while since I have talked about Triangle's Fiber to the Home (FTTH) projects. Before we finish this year's upgrades, we are already working on next year's projects. The FTTH projects take a lot of planning. It entails cost estimation of the project, mapping, obtaining right-of-way, staking, putting out bids for contractors and ordering materials before the project even begins. And like any business, this must all be done within a budget. I am happy to report that we are on budget and should be done with this year's projects on time.

Currently, we have contractors plowing fiber in Whitewater, Reed Point, Stanford and a portion of Big Timber. They are expected to have the plowing completed in these service areas by the end of December. As routes are completed, Triangle is contacting members to schedule their conversion to fiber. If you are on the routes scheduled for this year, please look for a call and a post card.

The good news is, after we finish this year's projects, we will have 30 of our 39 exchanges completely upgraded to fiber. We still have 5 full exchanges and 4 partial exchanges left to be upgraded. As the year comes to a close, I want to thank all of our employees for putting in the extra effort to achieve what we have accomplished with all of our projects.

To finish this year's last report, I want to wish you all a Happy Thanksgiving, Merry Christmas, and Happy New Year! Stay safe and healthy!

PHISHING EMAILS- AVOID THE BAIT!

Phishing emails are emails that appear to be from to be from a company or people you know. But they are scammers. They may send you a link to click on asking for personal information like a password, social security number or date of birth or they may even try to gain access to your computer.

Here is how phishing works:

You get an email or text

- They pretend to be someone you know and ask you to click on a link, give you a password, bank account number or other personal information.
- You think it is real
- Scammers can spoof logos and use fake email addresses. They use familiar company names or pretend to be someone you know.
- They pressure you
- The messages urge you to act now or something bad will happen.

Clicking on a link from a scammer can allow them to install programs that lock you out of your computer and compromise your personal information.

How to avoid the bait:

Check it out before you click

- Call the company or person directly who you think is contacting you. If you have a contact at the company, use the number or email you know is correct.
- If you do not know them, look up the website for the company name they gave you and see if the person who contacted you really works there.
- · NEVER open an email attachment if you do not know who it came from or why you received it

Scam tip-offs

- You do not do business with the company that contacted you.
- Your name is missing, words are spelled wrong or it contains bad grammar.

Be careful- some phishing schemes look very real, check it out and protect yourself.

CAPITAL CREDITS – ALLOCATION, RETIREMENT AND DISCOUNTING

Triangle Communications is excited to announce a new voluntary discounted capital credit program. Current and past members who choose to participate are now able to receive their discounted value of the member's capital credits. Members may elect not to participate and continue to receive annual refunds over our current rotation period.

When will I receive my statement and elect to participate form?

The statement should have arrived the week of October 19th.

How do I elect to participate?

You must return the opt in form to be included.

What years are included in the voluntary discounted capital credit program?

The years included will be years that you had active service between 1992 and 2019 as a part of the cooperative.

What is the current number of years capital credits are paid out over?

Currently we are on a 28-year rotation of paying out capital credits through annual refunds.

When is the deadline to respond if I want to elect to participate?

You will have until November 30, 2020 to return the form if you elect to participate in this voluntary program.

If I elect to participate, when will I receive the check for the discounted capital credits?

Checks will arrive no later than December 31, 2020.

What are my options for methods to return the form?

There are four convenient methods you may use:

- Return using the postage paid return envelope that was included with the letter and elect to participate form.

- E-mail it to capitalcredits@itstriangle.net

What do I need to do if I decide not to participate?

If you choose not to voluntarily opt into the program, do nothing and your capital credit account balance will remain unchanged.

If I change my mind, can I sign up to participate after the deadline of 11/30/2020?

At this point, this is a one-time offer to participate in the discounting program. If a similar program is offered in the future, you could elect to participate at that point in time.

Montana Relay is a public service that guarantees all citizens access to prompt, professional and accurate communication through a telephone. Consumers of these specialized services, specifically individuals who are deaf, deaf-blind, hard of hearing or have difficulty speaking, can communicate on the telephone via TTY, Voice Carry Over (VCO), Hearing Carry Over (HCO), Speech-to-Speech (STS), Spanish and Captioned Telephone. The helps ensure the ability to connect with family, friends or businesses with ease.

How Montana Relay works:

Dial 711 or the toll-free number listed below to connect with Montana Relay, A qualified Communication Assistant (CA) will ask for the area code and the number of the person you wish to call and will begin relaying the conversation. Generally, the CA will voice the typed message from the text telephone (TTY) user to the person on the other end. The CA then relays the spoken words by typing them back to the TTY user.

Specialized Services:

Montana Relay offers specialized services for individuals who have difficulty speaking, including Spanish-speaking residents. Specially trained CAs are on hand to assist in these types of calls by dialing the associated number provided on this page. Since Montana Relay offers a variety of services please refer to the website listed or call Montana Relay Customer Care for more detailed instruction on how a particular call is processed.

Captioned Telephone:

Captioned Telephone is ideal for any individual that has a loss of hearing but are still able to speak for themselves. A captioned telephone works like any other telephone with one essential difference: Emergency Calls it allows users to listen to their phone conversations while reading word-for-word captions of what's said to them.

Access to Services:

Both 711 and the 800 numbers are toll free calls and provide access to the same relay services. If you are experiencing trouble dialing 711 when trying to reach Montana Relay, please call Montana Relay Customer Care.

All TRS and English Captioned Telephone services are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Spanish Captioned Telephone is available daily from 6:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. MST. Consumers may place relay calls to English-speaking and Spanish-speaking people within Montana, across the United States and even internationally. Each conversation is handled with strict confidentiality.
