

# RECIPE

## **Biscuits Supreme**

#### **INGREDIENTS**

2 cups flour ½ tsp. salt 4 tsp. baking powder ½ tsp. cream of tartar 2 tsp. sugar ½ cup shortening <sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> cup milk

#### **DIRECTIONS**

Mix dry ingredients, cut in shortening until mixture is crumbly. Add and just stir until dough follows fork around the bowl. Drop by spoonfuls on ungreased cookie sheet and bake at 450° for 10-12 minutes.

# RECIPE

## **Bacon & Egg Breakfast Cups**

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 1 pkg bacon cooked, then cut in half 6 eggs
- 1 Tbsp milk

½ cup grated mozzarella or cheddar cheese 2 green onions

Optional Ingredients: tomatoes, mushrooms, swiss chard, spinach, shredded zucchini, bell pepper or cooked ham

#### **DIRECTIONS**

Cook your bacon, I baked mine. Cut bacon in half and line a muffin cup with 3-4 half pieces. The more bacon you use, the easier the egg cup will slip out of the muffin tin. Preheat oven to 350°. In a bowl whisk together the eggs, milk, and cheese. Then stir in the onions and any other additions you would like to the egg mixture. Pour the egg mixture evenly between the 6-8 cups you are making. The egg mixture should be just below the top of the muffin tin. Bake for 25-35 minutes. It may take longer depending on how many optional ingredients you have added. Serve it with some avocado slices, if desired!

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 28 oz. pkgs cream cheese
- 1 4 oz. jar pimientos, drained thoroughly and chopped into somewhat smaller pieces
- 1 cup parmesan cheese
- 1 Tbsp Tabasco sauce
- 1 tsp. garlic salt
- 1 tsp. onion salt

½ cup coarsely chopped walnuts 1/3 cup finely chopped walnuts

#### **DIRECTIONS**

Mix cream cheese, pimientos, parmesan cheese, Tabasco sauce, garlic salt, onion salt and coarsely chopped walnuts. Chill in refrigerator until it can be formed into a ball. Refrigerate ball until firm. Roll in finely chopped walnuts and serve with crackers.

# FOOD, FUN AND PRIZES AND THE TRIANGLE ANNUAL MEETING!

Triangle Telephone Cooperative Association, Inc., doing business as Triangle Communications (Triangle), held its 64th Annual Meeting of Members on Saturday, October 21, 2017. Over 140 voting members plus numerous guests attended the meeting held in the Student Union Building on the campus of Montana State University-Northern in Havre. The attendees enjoyed a delicious meal catered by MSU-Northern.

Many important topics related to the cooperative were discussed including the changes from the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) that will reduce the cost recovery mechanisms Triangle receives from the Universal Service Fund (USF). Triangle CEO, Craig Gates, talked about ways Triangle is diversifying to bring more revenue into the cooperative by offering a Managed WiFi service and bringing a fiber-fed service to businesses in Havre along the Highway 2 corridor. Mr. Gates shared that over half of Triangle's 39 exchanges will be connected to fiber by the end of 2017 and that Triangle continues to work on cost-saving ways to bring fiber to the remaining exchanges. Triangle's mobile service, Triangle Mobile, also experienced continued growth in 2016.

Trustees for two districts were re-elected by members at the meeting. Richard Swartz was re-elected as one of two trustees representing District 1, which covers White Sulphur Springs, Martinsdale, Judith Gap, Harlowton, Melville, Big Timber, Reed Point, Rapelje, Broadview and Molt. Tom Bangs was re-elected to represent District 3, which covers Geraldine, Fort Benton, South Chester, Chester, Joplin, Rudyard, Simpson and North Havre. Richard Stuker was selected to serve as Board President, Tom Bangs will be Vice President and Rick Pokorny remains Secretary/Treasurer.

The winner of Triangle's Annual Photo Contest was determined by balloting at the meeting. The \$200 grand

prize photo titled "Fox Den at Martinsdale Reservoir" was taken by Morning Sun Yellow Pony of Martinsdale. Loreen Sheline of White Sulphur Springs received second place. Third place was Jill Conover of Broadview. Laci Keller of Big Sandy took the fourth place photo. In fifth place was Leah Fox of Fort Belknap and Mindy Oltrogge of Stanford took sixth place. # **GENERAL MANAGER/CEO MESSAGE**

Happy New Year from everyone at Triangle Communications! As we start the new year, net neutrality has become big news. At press time, we are still waiting to see what the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) will decide on this topic. In the past, before net neutrality, Triangle did not try to implement rules or processes to avoid the ideas surrounding net neutrality. Triangle currently has no

plans to change how we operate your network or how you have access to your network. Triangle has not and does not plan to share your personal information with third parties.

Another topic I would like to discuss is capital credits. In late November or early December, you probably received a capital credit check from Triangle. Others may call them patronage dividends or patronage refunds, but at Triangle, we call them capital credits.

What are capital credits? First, they are an important benefit of being a cooperative member. As a member, you own the cooperative. Members are allocated a portion of the cooperative's profits each year depending on their usage with the cooperative.

There is a lot that goes into a capital credit retirement. The Triangle Board determines each year if the allocations can be paid out as a general retirement of past allocations while still maintaining the co-op's financial strength. In 2017, a general retirement of capital credits of approximately \$986,846.56 was approved. This amount represents 50% of the capital credits earned by members in 1991 and 0.5% (1/2 of 1%) of those earned from 1992 to 2016.

Be assured that Triangle and our employees remain committed to our members and the communities we serve.

#### **Emergency Calls**

Please note that 711 is only to be used to reach Montana Relay, In an EMERGENCY you should continue to use 911. For emergencies, call 911 or your local emergency service TTY number directly. The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requires that all 911 centers have a TTY and are prepared to handle emergency calls placed in this manner. Montana Relay will make every effort to assist you in an emergency. However, it is important to understand that relay centers are not 911 centers and do not assume responsibility for emergency calls.

# Telecommunications Access Program

Montana Relay is a public service which guarantees all citizens access to prompt, professional and accurate communication through the telephone. Consumers of these specialized services, specifically individuals who are deaf, deaf-blind, hard of hearing or have difficulty speaking, can communicate on the telephone via TTY, Voice Carry Over (VCO), Hearing Carry Over (HCO), Speech-to-Speech (STS), Spanish and Captioned Telephone in order to connect with family, friends or businesses with ease.

#### **How Montana Relay works:**

Dial 711 or the appropriate toll-free number provided to connect with Montana Relay. A qualified Communication Assistant (CA) will ask for the area code and number of the person you wish to call and will begin relaying the conversation. Generally, the CA will voice the typed message from the text telephone (TTY) user to the person on the other end. The CA then relays the spoken words by typing them back to the TTY user.

#### **Specialized Services:**

Montana Relay offers specialized services for individuals who have difficulty speaking and for Spanish speaking residents. Specially trained CAs are on hand to assist in these types of calls by dialing the associated number provided on this page. Since Montana Relay offers a variety of services please refer to the website listed or call Montana Relay Customer Care for more detailed instruction on how a particular call is processed.

#### **Captioned Telephone:**

Captioned Telephone is also available and ideal for individuals with hearing loss who are able to speak for themselves. A captioned telephone works like any other telephone with an essential difference: it allows users to listen to their phone conversations while reading word-for-word captions of what's said to them.

#### **Access to Services:**

Both 711 and the 800 numbers are toll free calls and provide access to the same relay services. If you are experiencing trouble dialing 711 to reach Montana Relay, please call Montana Relay Customer Care.

All services are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Consumers may place relay calls to English and Spanish speaking persons within Montana, across the United States and even internationally. By law, each conversation is handled with strict confidentiality.

# STRICKS AG "WE'RE YOUR FARMER"

It's been a little more than a year since Triangle Communications' Fiber Installers and contractors left Chester following a long process of system design, easements, plowing and installing a new fiber optic network to the community. To most residents, it was a necessary and

appreciated upgrade of phone and Internet service, but at Stricks Ag LLC, it was a game changer.

Stricks Ag, a commodities company, was founded in 2014 by young Liberty County ag producers Whitney and Patrick Wicks and the Streits. The combination of their last names equals STRICKS, which is how the company was named. They own and operate elevators and a state-of-the-art processing facility in Chester and are expanding operations throughout Montana and central Canada. The facility cleans, sorts and packages pulse and specialty grain products in bulk, totes and bags with a rail and truck delivery system throughout North America and overseas. Recently certified as a Kosher processor, quality assurance is key in their daily operations. Their new partnership with the Redwood Group helps diversify their customer base and brings new experience and expertise to the operation.

CEO Tyler Streit was looking pretty "tech savvy" sporting a phone headset while he strategically

set the height of his desktop to a standing position when I recently visited. His wife and co-owner Jillien Streit commented, "We have taken full advantage of Triangle's fiber optics in Chester" as she showcased several monitors and computer setups in what they call the "bull room".

Using technology, Stricks Ag LLC works closely with their new partner the Redwood Group LLC, an employee-owned commodity merchandising and supply company. Brad Kantorowicz, VP of Operations and Procurement, explained their online platform that allows them to interact directly with Redwood Group staff in Mission, KS. This platform allows them to work jointly on projects, share screens and video chat. It was an exciting conversation and setting that didn't reflect the traditional model of a group with a trademarked mantra: "We're Your Farmer".

"Montana is the #1 producer of pulse crops in the U.S. and we're positioned to handle a large portion of that. Our goal is to add value by processing at least 80% of that raw product that comes through Stricks. We're growing fast, but proud of the 25-working staff we've assembled. We're progressive and have immediate expansion plans but remain dedicated to our families and community while working hard to strengthen relationships with product movers such as BNSF and especially with truckers we work with across the state," stated Jillien. She added, "When I graduated high school, I couldn't wait to get out of Chester. Now I realize the values of living rural and want to make it better to keep more of our kids here and attract new people."

My visit ended with a quick tour of the plant to see lentils being cleaned and processed. I must admit, it's exciting to see a bagged product ready to ship overseas labeled Chester. Montana.
