

#### **Cold Broccoli Salad**

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 1 (10 oz.) pkg. frozen chopped broccoli
- 1 (10 oz.) pkg. frozen green peas Dash of lemon juice
- 3 stalks celery, chopped
- 1 small onion, finely chopped
- 2/3 cup mayonnaise
- 1/3 cup sour cream Salt and pepper to taste
- 3 hard cooked eggs, chopped

#### DIRECTIONS

Thaw broccoli, drain well, press out as much moisture as possible. Thaw peas in paper towels. Combine broccoli and peas. Sprinkle with lemon juice. Add celery, onion, salt and pepper. Combine mayonnaise and sour cream. Stir into vegetables until moistened. Add chopped eggs and mix lightly. Adjust seasoning to taste. Serve in lettuce lined bowl or as individual salad.

#### **Rhubarb Dessert**

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 4 cups fresh or frozen rhubarb
- 1 ½ cups sugar, divided
- 1/4 cup shortening
- 1 egg
- 1 cup flour 2 tsp. baking powder
- ¼ tsp. salt
- ½ cup milk

#### DIRECTIONS

Combine 1 cup sugar and rhubarb; cook over medium heat for about 10 minutes or until tender. Cream shortening and remaining sugar; beat in egg and vanilla. Combine the flour, baking powder and salt; add to creamed mixture alternately with milk. Beat until just combined. Pour the rhubarb over the batter. Bake at 350° for 35 to 45 minutes or until toothpick comes out clean.

Love for a building and community put Valerie Carr back into business in 2015 in downtown Hobson. **Tall Boys Tayern** is a family effort with Valerie and daughter-in-law. Liz sharing proprietor duties. Known throughout the region for their Prime Rib dinner, they have a full menu that includes steak, seafood, hand pressed burgers and a full bar featuring Montana distilled liquors and tap brews. Fresh food is a priority and future plans include an onsite green house to ensure quality.

Geographically located between Great Falls and Billings, their large meeting room with seating for 100 and new outdoor pavilion make them a great option for large parties and groups. The building interior showcases the carpentry skills of the Carr family and includes many distinct and historic furnishings.

Catering is a large portion of their business model and Valerie states. "sometimes we have 14+ bodies at various locations, all putting out great food and service."









In the heart of Hobson, you will find Nancy's **Country Market**. This historic building on Central Avenue was originally constructed as a hotel, but has served the community as a grocery store for over 100 years.



Hobson native. Nancy Epkes, purchased the business in 1988 and as many grocery stores disappear across rural America. Nancy's Country Market continues to be a community anchor. providing ready access

to fresh foods, a full line of groceries along with hunting and fishing licenses. During our visit, Nancy expressed her appreciation for strong community loyalty and summer traffic through the region, including visitors to Ackley Lake for helping to sustain the business.



Towards the end of Central Ave. is Gramma Ruby's Café, a quaint stop where you can meet the locals over hearty breakfast and lunch



specials, specialty coffees, burgers or my favorite, homemade bread pudding. James and Tina Brawdy purchased the Café and moved to Hobson in 2004 from Sacramento to live a rural lifestyle. School work was also on the menu when I stopped earlier this spring as the Brawdy's youngest children, Gloria and Zechariah were seated at the counter finishing their lessons.



Additional businesses on Central Avenue include Hobson Insurance, (a nationwide insurance company with 12+ employees), Hobson Museum and Library, 7-day Weekend Bar, The Shear Shack II. US Post Office and Central Montana Veterinary Services. Hobson has a population of 215 people and is located just north of Highway 200 in Judith Basin County.



The excerpts from the bylaws shown below explain the election and nomination process. We encourage all cooperative members to take an active interest in their cooperative! 
#### ARTICLE V: TRUSTEES

SECTION 5.03. Election. At each annual meeting of the members, the members shall elect trustees by secret written ballot from among those natural persons who are members or who are operating or chief officers of any members that are not natural persons (such as corporations, churches or other legal entities), or those officers' designees, and who are otherwise qualified as provided in Section 5.05 of these bylaws. When the total number of nominees does not exceed the total number of trustees to be elected, or when the number of nominees for a trustee District does not exceed the number of trustees to be elected from that District, and if there is no objection, the members may dispense with secret written balloting with respect to that particular election or with respect to the election for that particular District. as applicable, and may conduct voting in any other proper manner. Each member present at the meeting is entitled to vote for one trustee candidate from each District for which a trustee election is being held; no member may vote for more than one nominee from each trustee District. A District nominee who receives a plurality of the votes cast for trustee of that District shall be elected. Drawing by lot shall resolve, where necessary, any tie votes.

#### SECTION 5.06. Nominations

a) Nominations by committee. Not less than forty-five (45) days nor more than seventy (70) days before the date of the annual meeting of the members at which trustees are to be elected, the Board shall appoint a committee on nominations consisting of not less than seven nor more than fourteen Association members. No member of the Board may serve on such committee. The committee shall prepare and post at the principal office of the Association, at least thirty (30) days before the annual member meeting, a list of nominations for trustees to be elected. listing such nominees separately by the District from which a trustee must be elected. The committee may include in such list a greater number of nominees for some or all trustee positions, provided that the committee clearly indicates, by District, those nominees who will oppose each other.

- b) Nominations by petition. Any fifteen or more Association members, acting together, may make additional nominations by written petition containing the name(s) and address(es) of the nominee(s) and the District from which each is nominated, and the signatures, printed names and addresses of the petitioners. The petitioners must deliver the petition so that it is received at the Association's principal office at Havre, Montana, not less than thirty (30) days prior to the annual member meeting. The Secretary shall post such nominations by petition at the same place where the list of nominations by committee is posted.
- c) List of nominees. The Secretary shall mail, with the notice of the annual member meeting or separately, but at least seven (7) days before the date of the annual member meeting, a statement of the number of trustees to be elected from each District. the names and addresses of the nominees and the District from which each is nominated, specifying separately those nominated by the committee on nominations and those nominated by petition, if any
- d) Nominations from the floor. At any meeting at which the members may or are required to elect trustees, and after announcing all nominations made by the committee on nominations and by petition as above provided, the chairperson of the meeting



or the chairperson's designee shall invite additional nominations from the floor and shall determine and announce, after each such nomination from the floor, the District in which each such nominee from the floor is qualified and the names of the other nominees from that District whom the nominee from the floor will oppose in such election. Any member, present in person at such meeting, may nominate from the floor another qualified member for election as trustee. The member making such nomination from the floor shall designate the District from which the nominee is nominated. No member may nominate from the floor more than one person.

e) Restrictions on eligibility. Neither the committee on nominations nor the members may nominate a person, even if otherwise qualified under Section 5.05 of these bylaws, to stand for election as trustee for more than one District at the same trustee election. No person may serve or be elected to serve as trustee for more than one District at the same time.
